House Resolution 456 calls on schools and State and local educational agencies to recognize that dyslexia has significant educational implications that must be addressed. This resolution was submitted in January 2014 by Congressman Bill Cassidy of Louisiana and currently has 111 co-sponsors.

The Bipartisan Congressional Dyslexia Caucus currently has 81 members.
